- A Flood Warden helps and prepares people in the local community that are at risk of flooding.
- A Flood Warden is important in the development and execution of a community flood plan – do you have one in your community?
- A Flood Warden provides a vital link between a local community and those responsible for responding to a flood incident

The role of a Flood Warden	
BEFORE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Identify problem areas within your community ✓ Identify vulnerable people and properties ✓ Write a community flood plan ✓ Monitor watercourses within the community ✓ Encourage sign up to free Flood Warnings ✓ Raise awareness of flood risk within the community
DURING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Communicate the risk of flooding within the community ✓ Heed emergency services advice at all times ✓ Disperse information from the Environment Agency and emergency services to residents ✓ Collect flood event information
AFTER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Provide guidance in the post flood clear up ✓ Collect post flood data and photos ✓ Take part in the post flood clear up if required
